

PRA Debuts E-Zine, New Website

The Popular Rotorcraft Association's new electronic magazine, officially called *Rotorcraft E-Zine*, published its first issue on December 1, 2010. As an introductory promotion, the e-zine was offered as a free download for all enthusiasts, whether PRA members or not. The PRA board voted in its September 23, 2010 meeting to make at least the first two issues available on this basis, then evaluate whether the electronic publication should be limited to the members-only section of www.pra.org.



Based on the format of Western Rotorcraft, the new Rotorcraft E-Zine debuted with 16 pages, including cover art featuring an in-flight photo of Brian Bird's Sparrow-Hawk taken at Rotors Over The Rockies 2010. News from western US chapters dominated the first issue, as chapters outside the Western Rotorcraft regional coop will need to be introduced to the idea of

creating monthly reports on activities with photos.

Also on December 1, PRA debuted its new website. (At right. Also see "Regional Report," page 2.)

Regional Report Paul Plack, NW/Mtn Rep

There's not much to report this month beyond the debut of the new PRA website and *Rotorcraft E-Zine*. There have been a lot of long

nights to get the first E-Zine out, and back in Ohio, PRA VP Tim O'Connor has had a similar ramp-up to get the website going. Both have further refinement ahead, but reaction so far has been very positive.

The first two issues (at least) of PRA's new electronic version of *Rotorcraft* are free to anyone, PRA member or not. Even recipients who choose not to become or remain PRA members will still get an occasional, single-page e-mail newsletter, including a preview of content in the forthcoming issue of *Rotorcraft*.

The website is slowly being populated with member benefits such as an electronic viewer loaded with all pre-2010 issues of PRA's magazines, *Rotorcraft*, and its predecessor, *Popular Rotorcraft Flying*. I believe PRA faced the choice to either communicate more effectively, or disappear into history. Personally, I think we've made the right choice.

New CO Chapter Gets Closer

The latest on the new Colorado Rotorcraft Association is the successful recruitment of enough PRA members to fill the minimums required for chapter affiliation. This will be a serious group of fliers. Eight members have flying aircraft, including three Xenons, two GyroBees, a Robinson R44, a SparrowHawk, and Todd Rieck's Yamaha-powered Air Command.

We can have it here in Colorado Springs, or electronically by a pre-arranged conference call with handouts via computer PDF, and shown on a web site. The regular phone charges to each participant for dialing in to an out-of-state number should be much less than gas to come to the meeting. (For me it is included in my phone plan, and no extra charge.)

Tailwheel Time at Chapter 31

The San Diego County Rotorcraft Club met on Tuesday, November 30 at SportFlyers at Gillespie Field to discuss the availability of tailwheel, fixedwing light sport aircraft for instruction of club members. The group is pursuing a strategy of providing a path for members to first get their Sport Pilot certificates in fixed-wing LSA, then add Gyroplane. This approach provides a way to at least get a base FAA certificate which won't expire, then allows the student to progress to gyroplane whenever circumstances allow access to a gyroplane instructor. It also means subsequent flight reviews, required at least every two years to maintain currency, and the periodic flights required to maintain minimum currency to carry passengers, can be accomplished in easily-rented fixed-wing aircraft.

Chapter 31's John Rountree (right) emailed members ahead of the meeting, and said, in part:

"Dave and I have talked to Mike and Jon at SportFlyers regarding flying instruction, specifically FW tail dragger instruction and aircraft rental. The object of this months meeting is to meet the owners of SportFlyers,



instructors, and inspect the aircraft...start you on your way to, at least, a sport pilots license with a gyro add on."

I was able to attend Rotors Over the Rockies here in Utah, the EAA AirVenture at Oshkosh, WI, the PRA convention at Mentone, IN, and the Ken Brock Freedom Fly-In at El Mirage, CA. November 13 Minutes & Detail

The meeting was called to order in a Dimdim online meeting session by President Doug Barker at 10:01am MST. Attendance included four members: Doug, Treasurer Nate Oldham and members Kevin Eaton and Glenn Kerr. Minutes were approved as published in the November Western Rotorcraft.

The treasurer's report indicated that as of October 31, 2010 funds on hand total \$1,091.09 in the bank, \$42.14 in the PayPal account, and outstanding checks totaling \$94.05, for net available funds of \$1,039.16 The report was approved. Off-Topic: Arlington's Barn

When space allows, this new section will feature articles of interest to aviators in general, whether or not they apply specifically to rotorcraft. The Arlington Fly-In is one of the longest-running regionals in the US. When PRA Chapter 30 was still active, this event was often designated as the site for the July meeting. This story shows what can be accomplished when a corps of dedicated volunteers gets a little helping hand from resources found in the neighborhood!

The 2010 <u>Arlington (WA) Fly-In</u> was held July 7 - 11. The event, about an hour's drive north of Seattle, is one of the biggest regionals in the US and, for the 2010 edition, organizers were looking for a theme for a display focusing on vintage aircraft. Executive Director Barb Tolbert (<u>interview</u>) says the discussions kept coming back to barnstorming, and eventually the team's graphic designer was asked to come up with a concept drawing of an appropriate barn.



The resulting sketch, which included a vintage windmill, excited everyone, but the effects of the recession on available funding looked like it would force a delay. But Arlington's experienced, dedicated volunteer corps wouldn't let that happen.

The design was completed, right down to a materials list which included the framing and siding lumber needed. Because the airport management couldn't allow the barn to be left in place after the event ended, and there was no budget for a crane, the barn was designed in four sections with beefed-up trusses, to allow moving it with a forklift already on hand. The final dimensions were 40'-x-20', 25' tall. But there was no money for lumber!

So, a volunteer found a portable sawmill, and brought it to the home of an airport neighbor who needed eight trees removed. The volunteers cut all the needed lumber, researched drying techniques, and fan-dried the stacked wood in a hangar over the winter. It's clear to look at the completed building that they absolutely nailed the desired look, down to the red-and-white paint.

A 1927 Monitor windmill was found stored in a hangar at the airport, where it had sat for 40 years, and was donated to the effort. Another volunteer headed up the windmill's restoration. The final touches came courtesy of the US Navy, which allowed volunteers to salvage window glass and steel roofing from condemned 70-year-old buildings on the airport.





During the event, the <u>Skagit Aero Education Museum</u> brought several of its stunning, restored vintage planes, and built displays in the barn. Local enthusiasts brought antique cars and even period clothing to complete the theme. Comments so far from attendees suggest the barn was a major hit with the public. Now that the event is over, it's been moved and reassembled elsewhere on the grounds for use as a storage building until next year's fly-in.
